Family Genealogies in the Taiwan Area. In 2003, the catalog added more than 9,000 records from the National Palace Museum, bringing the total to over 14,000. In September 2003, the NCL embarked on a "Taiwan Family Genealogy Arrangement Plan" on the basis of the material collected in the database system.

1. NCL representatives participated in the 2004 Taipei International Book Exhibition (TIBE). The library display showcased the NCL's progress in creating a digital collection, including such online systems as Taiwan Memory, Taiwan Info, Dissertation and Thesis Abstract System (DATAS), National Bibliographic Information Network (NBINet), ISBN.net, and READncl: Remote Electronic Access/Delivery System. NCL publications at the TIBE exhibit, including Century Old Images of Taiwan and Biographical Sketches of Historical Figures in Taiwan: Ching, Ming and Japanese Occupation Period, also received a lot of attention from fair goers.
