NCL Celebrates 70th Anniversary

The National Central Library celebrated its 70th anniversary this year with a weeklong series of activities from April 18 to 23.

The first event was a "Seminar on NCL Development Strategies and Prospects", at which library experts and scholars were invited to provide their suggestions and comments on the sub-topics of "Library Collection Development and National Bibliography" and "Inter-library Cooperation and Knowledge Services." NCL Director Dr. Juang Fang-rung (莊芳榮) presided over the seminar. Prof. Wang Chen-ku (王振鵠) was the keynote speaker at the first session, during which feedback on the National Archives and National Catalog was provided by Prof. Wang Mei-ling (王梅玲), Prof. Wu Ming-te (吴明德), Director Chiu Chiung-you (邱炯友) Prof. Nancy Ou-lan Chou (胡歐蘭), Director Cheng Heng-hsiung (鄭恆雄), Director Hsueh Li-kuei (薛理桂), and Prof. Lai Tingming (賴鼎銘). The second session addressed the topics of "Inter-library Cooperation", "Document Delivery", and "Knowledge Web Portals". It was joined by Director Ellen Hao-ying Fan (范豪英), Prof. Chen Li-hsiang (陳立 祥), Prof. Chen Chao-chen (陳昭珍), Prof. Chen Hsueh-hua (陳雪華), Director Hsiang Chieh (項潔), Director Huang Hong-chu (黃鴻珠), Prof. Huang Muhsuan (黃慕萱), Prof. Yang Mei-hua (楊美華), and Director Karl Min Ku (顧敏).

On April 21, the day of the 70th anniversary, the Taiwan Memory and Taiwan Info systems were launched. There was also an anniversary reception attended by local and foreign dignitaries, including President Chen Shui-bian.

About 200 people attended a two-day "Conference on Libraries and Reading Activities" on April 22 and 23. Yin Yun-peng (殷允芃) of Commonwealth magazine delivered the keynote speech at the conference, which addressed the following six topics (speakers are indicated in parentheses):

NCL Launches New Information Systems

During the celebration of its 70th anniversary on April 21 this year, the National Central Library launched two timely information systems—"Taiwan Memory" and "Taiwan Info".

Taiwan Memory was established to serve as a digital archive of documents and other materials on Taiwan history with the objective of preserving Taiwan's historical memory. The system includes text, image and audio materials in digital form and presented in the topical areas of people, events, eras, places, and objects. This material is supplemented by various "Special Digital Collections" and linked with the extensive research documents stored at the NCL to comprehensively present the perspectives, attitudes, and faiths of Taiwan at different stages of its history.

The distinguishing traits of the Taiwan Memory and Taiwan Info systems are as follows:

- 1. The systems comprise extensive text, audio, and still and animated image content, including nearly 40 years of local television news material and programs tracing back to the beginning of TV broadcasting in Taiwan.
- 2. Both systems were developed in accordance with a well-designed digital preservation plan covering information organization, value adding, searching, knowledge collection and other applications, technical standards and criteria for digital conversion of materials, copyright management, and dissemination of digital information. Accessible through the NCL website, this rich collection of resources presents a living portrait of Taiwan's past in the hope of awakening
