National Reading Campaign

National reading campaigns have been one of the focal promotion areas of the Cabinet-level Council for Cultural Affairs (CCA) and Ministry of Education (MOE) in recent years, and a number of programs and plans have been drafted under their policy direction to nurture interest in reading in Taiwan. One such program is the "National Reading Campaign" organized by the National Taichung Library from April 1 to June 17 this year with assistance from the CCA and MOE and support from the Taipei Public Library, Kaohsiung Municipal Library, various county and city government cultural bureaus. The campaign featured a series of activities, including book recommendations, writer lectures, literature study, online reading, and composition contests, all aimed at encouraging reading in daily life, promoting libraries as learning centers, and building a reading-friendly environment in Taiwan.

As part of the event, the CCA invited experts and scholars from the business, government and

■ NCL Holds 2006 Chinese International Digital Cooperation Symposium

The NCL held the 2006 North American East Asian Library Symposium: Cooperation in Digitization of Chinese Books in General and Rare Book Collections on April 20 to 21. The symposium, timed to coincide with the NCL's 73rd anniversary, aimed to forge closer cooperation ties with U.S. libraries by providing a forum for exchanges between representatives of leading East Asian libraries in the U.S. and local scholars and experts and in the field of rare books.
